A High Council is made up of:

- Active commissioners who are territorial commanders or who hold an international or national headquarters or territorial leadership appointment*
- Territorial commanders with the rank of colonel
- Territorial leaders with the rank of colonel

Any active officer can be nominated – there are more than

The secretariat, including legal advisors, translators and recorders, helps the High Council to run smoothly

The council prepares questions approximately...

...more than two

thirds of members in one of the first three ballots

...more than 50% of members from the fourth ballot onwards



PROCESS

A High Council is convened and begins with prayer and worship

A President, Vice-President and Chaplain are elected

The High Council agrees Orders of Procedure

The Committee of the Whole discusses any matters relevant to the election

Council members make nominations

Nominees accept or decline



The new General-elect is announced

The doors of the High Council chamber are opened, the President announces the new General-elect and the news is livestreamed around the world.
